Approve minutes

Sarah Blake made a motion to the approve the May 7 minutes. Hanna Novy seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by voice vote.

Discipline Update

Kathy Ehman, Assistant Superintendent, provide the committee with a discipline update. She talked about HB 5141. If a student is suspended, the district still has to provide educational services to the student. The discipline policy is disseminated in student handbooks.

Kimberly Meno asked if in-school suspension count? Kathy said yes and no. If students still have access, it doesn't count against the school. They just need to have access to the materials.

There were 370 fewer occurrences this year. We had more students but fewer episodes. Overall, 12 percent had some sort of discipline. It's 4 to 16 percent among the buildings.

Ryan indicated that Eagle Creek had a low number of kids suspended. When school started, they had about a dozen kids. They try to arrange a place for kids to go if they're dysregulated. Referrals are down. They have a primary version of a debrief document. When the kids come down to the office, they have to make it right first. At K-1, they draw pictures. Older grades reflect on what choice did they make, what should they make, and how are they going to make it right? Ryan feels like that has created more of a conversation. Sometimes leads to a referral.

Restorative Circles- Some kids get really physical at recess, use restorative circle, talking stick, chance to speak, common theme is they need to find a way to make it right. Need to have a plan in place. It's a lot of work, not easy, it's a process.

At Weston, there are no out of school suspensions. Every week, Weston has a school wide restorative circle. It's important that the students are in school. Teachers can run circles as well.

Incidents reduced by about a quarter districtwide



Restorative Practices-These will be part of the Summer Academy offerings.

Kent Prairie - Love and Logic school, parents more involved in the process, element of support for student.

Kathy indicated that in 2016, there was a prohibition for isolation and restraint. This relates to IEPs and general education kids. There are rigid regulations around kids who are restrained. A form needs to be filled out and all data needs to be reported to OSPI.
