JOB TITLE: Painter

CLASSIFICATION: Classified LOCATION: District

REPORTS TO: Director of Support Services

HOURS: Flexible scheduling of days and hours/ approximately 70 days/year

SALARY: Per PSE Schedule

SUMMARY: Under the supervision of the Director of Support Services, the painter will perform painting, including preparations for painting and finish painting of surfaces and areas both inside and outside of the buildings within the District.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

- Finishing, repairing and reconditioning of new and existing walls by patching, taping, priming and painting.
- Paint both inside and outside of buildings within the District. Prepare surfaces by hand or power scraping, sanding, etc.
- Operate and maintain power equipment and hand tools such as an airless paint sprayer, pressure
 washer, carpentry power tools, and vacuum as required in the performance of preparing and the
 finishing of assignments.
- Move and replace furniture as needed, returning area to a clean and safe environment.
- Perform light carpentry for replacing molding and trims.
- Follow District Policy & Procedures when working with paints and chemicals and the potential exposure to individuals in the affected area.
- Ability to work up to 30 feet above ground.
- Order materials and supplies as required.
- Report misuse, safety concerns or abuse of District facilities and equipment to the Director of Support Services
- Comply with all district, state, federal policies, procedures, codes and laws.
- Maintain the ability to be a self-starter.
- Possess the ability to follow instructions.
- Establish and maintain positive communications and working relations with staff, students and the
 public with a focus on commitment to quality customer service and courteous, helpful, friendly
 cooperation.
- Other duties may be assigned by the Support Services Director to accommodate the efficient operation of the department.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

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EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE:

Minimum requirement is high school diploma or equivalent and successful employment experience in a painter position.

CERTIFICATES, LICENSES, REGISTRATIONS:

Valid Washington State driver's license CPR/First Aid card (may be required)

LANGUAGE SKILLS:

Ability to read and interpret documents such as safety rules, operating and maintenance instructions, and procedure manuals. Ability to write routine reports and correspondence. Ability to speak effectively to administration, staff and students.

MATHEMATICAL SKILLS:

Ability to calculate figures and amounts, and to apply concepts of basic mathematics.

REASONING ABILITY:

Ability to solve practical problems and deal with a variety of concrete and abstract variables. Ability to interpret a variety of instructions furnished in written, oral, diagram, or schedule form.

OTHER SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of painting and wood preservation methods

PHYSICAL DEMANDS: The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to walk; stand; use the hands to handle, finger or feel objects, tools, or controls; reach with hands and arms; climb; balance; stoop, kneel, or crouch, and bend or twist at the neck and trunk more than the average person. The employee continuously uses hand strength to grasp tools and frequently climb ladders. The employee must frequently lift and/or move 50 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 90 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT: The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

There are no unusual environmental conditions. The employee regularly works both indoors and outdoors. The employee may work with or near moving mechanical equipment, and will work with painting and cleaning products such as stripping solutions, disinfectants, degreasers and some aerosol sprays. While performing the duties of this job, the employee occasionally will walk on slippery surfaces. The noise level in the work environment is usually moderate. The employee must be able to meet deadlines with time constraints and interact with students, other employees and the public.
