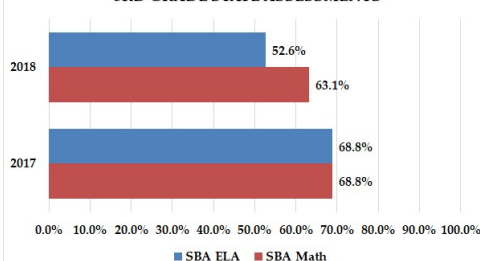

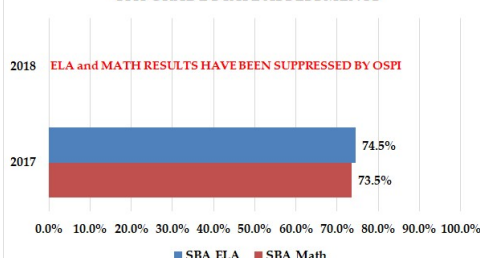

Student Assessment Result Comparisons

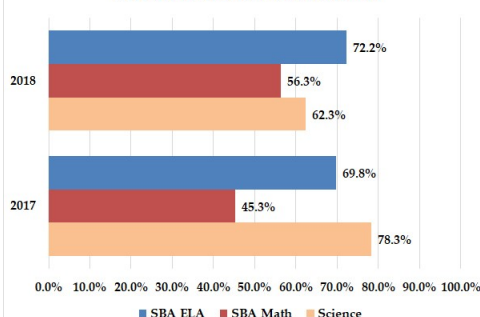
3RD GRADE STATE ASSESSMENTS

Facility Use

Pioneer Elementary opened for the 2002-03 school year. This two-story elementary school houses 31 classrooms for use as kindergarten through fifth-grade classes, music, art, technology, special education and remedial programs for both math and reading. The facility also includes a multi-purpose room with a stage for use as a gymnasium, lunchroom and for assemblies and events. School Improvement Plan

Our staff at Pioneer has been working toward the improvement of academic achievement for all students. We are utilizing the four questions of DuFour's professional learning community cycle of improvement. Our grade level teams meet weekly to analyze reading and math data, set goals, and implement key strategies to support each student. This year Pioneer is focusing on three big areas. First, our school staff are engaging in a book study, called Mathematical Mindsets, which focuses on teaching all children that they have vast mathematics potential and the power of the phrase, "You don't know how to do this yet". We are also utilizing the powerful strategy of number talks daily in every classroom. Our second big area of focus is inclusion of all our students. We believe that every student deserves to be in classrooms with their same-age peers. Inclusion is a way of life-a way of living together--that is based on a belief that each individual is valued and belongs. Our third area is to ensure that each child feels a part of Pioneer and wants to come to school. We are promoting better attendance by having rewards for perfect attendance and having open conversations with families to overcome obstacles of coming to school.
