


Our School's Mission

School Improvement Plan

For the 2018/19 school year, SVLC is focusing our collective efforts on increasing our students mathematical fluency. This year our goal is to have every SVLC student show grade-level proficiency on mathematical standards as measured by SBAC, iReady, and Course Pass Rates. SVLC has secured a number of varied resources to help individually target and tackle lagging mathematical skills in every student. These resources include supplemental online programs, creative scheduling allowing for students to receive daily math support, collaborative tutoring with National Honor Society students from our District high school, progress monitoring through iReady, and monthly diagnostic growth assessments to target gaps in fluency. Campus-wide, SVLC has committed to ensuring mathematical skills are embedded across all content areas.
