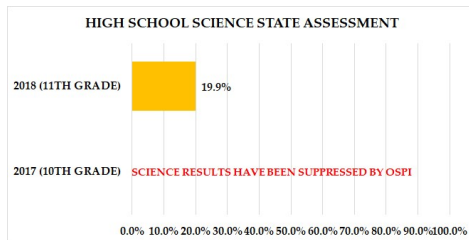

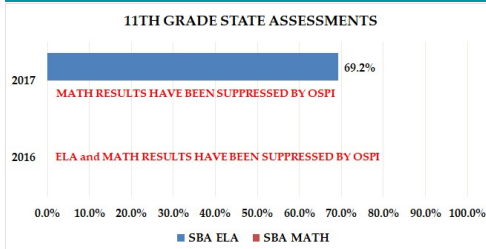

Our school site consists of 33,800 square feet housing 14 classrooms and 9 offices. The site houses Weston High School, our Alternative Online Program, our Open Doors Youth Re-Engagement Program, two ESD educational programs for students throughout Snohomish County, and Everett Community College machining, employment training programs, GED, Adult High School Completion and English Language Learner programs. In addition, our school is a meeting place for many other organizations in our community.

School Improvement Plan

Weston High School is a diverse school of choice providing innovative learning opportunities that prepares students for college, career and life. Weston focuses on project/problem-based learning (PBL), positive behavior intervention supports (PBIS), contemporary grading practices and multi-tiered systems of support for our students' success.

Weston High School staff addresses the whole child through numerous approaches including Trauma-Informed Practices, Restorative Practices, Staff/Student intentional relationship building, mental health and substance abuse wrap-around services, weekly whole-school Community Meetings, Intervention/Remediation/Enrichment period, school clubs, Guest Career Speakers, and Monthly Awards/Rewards for attendance and academics.

Our focus this year is on: instructional improvement through PBL; cultural improvement through Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), PBIS, Trauma-Informed Practices and Restorative Practices; closing the gap - emphasis on math, attendance and retention, credit completion, and progress monitoring.
