






Presidents Elementary was project number three of a four-part bond voters approved in March 2000. The building is designed to accommodate 650 students, grades kindergarten through fifth-grade. The school is located in the "Old Town" zone of Arlington, which preserves the historic quality of the traditional town center. The building design takes this intent into account, respecting the historic Roosevelt Building and other surrounds. You are invited to become an active part of our school.

School Improvement Plan

As part of Presidents' School Improvement Plan in the area of math, all certificated teachers are participating in Number Talk book studies in grade level teams. Teachers are modeling Number Talks for each other and are teaming with our district's Math Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) to implement Number Talks within the classroom. Students are being provided with opportunities to strengthen their number sense skills and are learning to be flexible with their mathematical thinking.

Presidents' second goal centers around improving school culture by providing leadership opportunities for all students. For example, fifth-grade students are serving as peer tutors for students who have been identified as needing additional supports before school. Another example is students participate as helpers in the lunch room by serving on our Green Team. They work during their recess to help turn our lunchroom back into a gymnasium in an efficient and effective manner.
