Approve minutes

Jen Fuller made a motion to approve the Jan. 7, 2019 meeting minutes. Maggie Bagwell seconded. The minutes were approved by voice vote.

School Schedules

The committee reviewed various school schedules. The committee narrowed the focus to the following:

- 1. School Year Schedule- Year Round
- 2. Secondary starting later (daily schedule)
 - MS and HS, need extra sleep, seeing good results, help with test scores, absenteeism
 - Kids have chance to eat breakfast, less tardiness
 - Sleeping longer, eating
- 3. Early Dismissals for Teacher PD

Change scope and sequence for teachers (especially if class structure)

- 4. Class Structure (7 or 8 periods)
 - Some middle schoolers are stressed about graduating from high school
 - Seven periods in middle school as an example

Dr. Sweeting asked the committee to break into small groups and decide which schedules are most important to the committee. The committee decided to focus on secondary schools starting later and adding seven or eight periods to the class day.

Equity and Cultural Competence

Arlington Public Schools was asked to present at an equity conference. They would like us to share what the ACE committee has researched. Mary, Natalie, Voni, Chrys, and will attend the conference on May 22. The title is "In Pursuit of Equity." The presenters will share what ACE is doing in this area.

Other conferences include Equity Leaders, Cultures Connecting on April 12 and Step Up at the Lynnwood Conference Center on April 26.

Jen, Will, Chrys and the student advisors shared stories talked about the equity circle they engaged in. They talked about having a culture of either having a sense of belonging in school or not belonging in school. They appreciated the honesty and that the stories were real.

- Parents- all parents have access to Naviance
