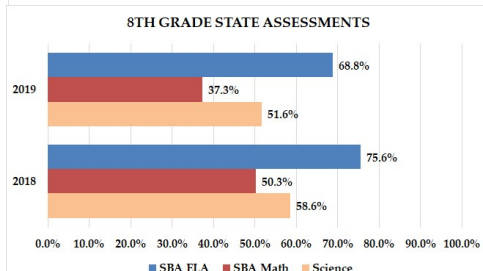
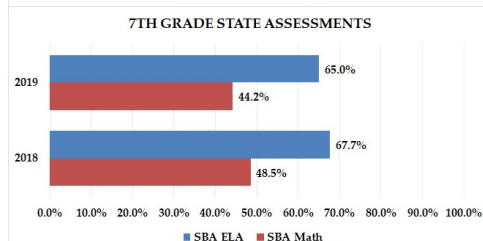
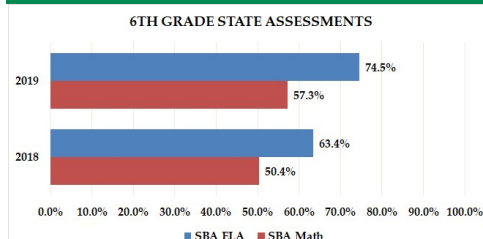

## Facility Use

Haller Middle School opened in September 2006. The school was constructed on the site where Arlington High School was located from the 1930s to 2002. In order to build Haller, many of the former high school buildings were demolished. Exceptions to this were the gymnasium and the music buildings that were remodeled and incorporated into the new school. The new portion of the school was connected to the remodeled gym and includes a commons, administrative offices and a two-story classroom wing. Haller's campus includes one tennis court, courtyard area, baseball/softball fields, soccer/football field with grandstands, lights and a track. You are invited to become an active part of our school.

## School Improvement Plan

HMS has two primary goals this year for school improvement. Our first goal is to familiarize ourselves and gain a better school-wide understanding of Rich Tasks. In order to achieve this goal, we will devote staff meeting time throughout the year for each department to share out a Rich Task example, followed by a group debrief. After we build working samples, each department will commit to utilizing Rich Tasks during the 2020-21 school year.

Our 2nd goal is centered around building a positive school climate. We are working to achieve this goal by bringing in a PBIS trainer for our staff. The trainer will work with our staff a total of 4 times throughout the year and will give us insight and tools on how to best manage behavior and increase student engagement. In addition, we have conducted behavior walks for establishing school expectations and created a system for sending positive messages home to students and parents.
