






Facility Use

Presidents Elementary was project number three of a four-part bond voters approved in March 2000. The building is designed to accommodate 650 students, grades kindergarten through fifth-grade. The school is located in the "Old Town" zone of Arlington, which preserves the historic quality of the traditional town center. The building design takes this intent into account, respecting the historic Roosevelt Building and other surrounds. You are invited to become an active part of our school.

School Improvement Plan

Presidents Elementary houses more than 580 P-5 students, including our district's Developmental Pre-School and Special Education ASSIST program for students with Autism.

All certificated teachers are in alignment with Arlington Public School's districtwide School Improvement Plan for mathematics. Teachers are implementing rich mathematical tasks into their lessons and working to modify the current curriculum in an effort to make it engaging and applicable to their everyday lives and the world around them.

Our second goal centers around improving school culture by providing social emotional and sensory supports for students while continuing to foster leadership opportunities. We have implemented a Social Skillstreaming curriculum for identified students in an effort to increase their ability to self-regulate and interact with others in a prosocial manner.

Arlington Public Schools educates all students, preparing and inspiring them to graduate and seek their full potential as lifelong learners.
