Facility Use

Haller Middle School opened in September 2006. The school was constructed on the site where Arlington High School was located from the 1930s to 2002. In order to build Haller, many of the former high school buildings were demolished. Exceptions to this were the gym

and music buildings that were remodeled and incorporated into the new



school. The new

portion of the school was connected to the remodeled gym and includes a commons, administrative offices and a two-story classroom wing. Haller's campus includes one tennis court, courtyard area, baseball/softball fields, soccer/football field with grandstands, lights and a track. School Improvement Plan

HMS has two primary goals for the 21-22 school year. Our first goal is to familiarize ourselves and gain a better school-wide understanding of UDL. In order to achieve this goal, we will devote staff meetings and early release time during the year to conduct research and engage in conversations about UDL and how it can impact student achievement.

We have brought in a PBIS trainer to work with our staff in managing and teaching student behaviors as students return from a pandemic. In addition, we have conducted behavior walks for establishing school wide expectations, created a system for parent communication around behavior, and utilized a system for sending positive messages home to parents and students.

Our second goal is centered around building a positive school climate.
