



### **Facility Use**

Presidents Elementary was project number three of a four-part bond voters approved in March 2000. The building is designed to accommodate 650 students, grades kindergarten through fifth-grade. The school is located in the "Old Town" zone of Arlington, which preserves the historic quality of the traditional town center. The building design takes this intent into account, respecting the historic Roosevelt Building and other surrounds. A 2020 Capital Levy funded the installation of a secured entryway at Presidents.
