Approve minutes

Sarah Blake made a motion to approve the Dec. 4 minutes. Ryan Barci seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by voice vote.

Elect Vice Chair

District Updates

- The State of the District Address will take place on Jan. 18. Culinary Arts students will be serving pie. There will also be a tour of Post Middle School.
- Dec. 13- Gary Howard was here. He talked about trauma informed practices. Next Tuesday, Cabinet will debrief with Gary Howard. The district wants to get better and better at being culturally responsive.
- Several administrators are taking part in the Washington State Learning Academy. They are in the process of identifying a problem of practice that they can address.

How School Funding Works

Gina Zeutenhorst, Executive Director of Financial Services, gave a presentation on how funding works in schools.

How is our budget divided?

It's divided into five funds: General Fund; ASB; Debt Service Fund; Capital Projects Fund and Transportation Vehicle Fund.

Where does our funding come from?

State dollars- 73.5% Federal dollars- 4.2% Local taxes- 19.7%

How is the money distributed? How is it used? What do we spend money on?

Two basic factors determine how resources are allocated to schools:

- The number of students at the school, and
- The special needs of students, such as poverty, disabilities, and limited English language skills.

Most of the general fund pays to support student learning in four ways:

- Teaching and teaching support
- School administration
- Central administration
- Other support activities

What do we spend money on?

- Salaries and benefits
- Benefits
- Other expenses- non personnel costs

HB 2242 State Funding

Zeutenhorst also talked about House Bill 2242. HB 2242 was a response to the McCleary decision. There will be changes in school funding taking place over the next three years. The upcoming 60-day supplemental Legislative session is important to try to get clarity surrounding HB 2242.

Maggie Bagwell made a motion to adjourn and Pedro Gonzales seconded the motion. There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 7:25.
