Arlington community member and district administrators recognized with WASA Awards

EVERETT- An Arlington community member and two Arlington Public Schools administrators were recognized with Sno-Isle Region 109 Washington Association of School Administrators (WASA) awards on May 11.

Ballew received the WASA Community Leadership Award for Arlington Public Schools. Under her leadership, the Arlington Education Foundation gave \$6,449.24 in teacher mini-grants this year with more grants still to be funded. She also sponsored bringing the Dolly Parton Imagination library to Arlington. Now, more than 508 families are registered and over 3,000 books have been mailed to families.

Mike Johnson- Executive Director of Human Resources, Arlington Public Schools

Johnson received the WASA Region 109 Award of Merit. He has served as the region's president for the 2016-17 school year. He has facilitated and organized the professional development opportunities, which were centered on legislative changes that impact school funding, bargaining in the midst of McCleary, evaluating central office administrators and negotiation strategies.
