
## Our School's Mission



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## Student Assessment Result Comparisons


3RD GRADE STATE ASSESSMENTS

## School Improvement Plan

Kent Prairie learning community members work toward the improvement of academic achievement and social/emotional growth for all students. We use a continuous improvement model as we investigate data sources, set goals, and implement key support strategies. Our staff members continue to enhance their "craft" as they take part in professional development related to student engagement, differentiation, assessment practices, trauma informed practices, and meeting the needs of students with different goals. As an internationally recognized professional learning community, we continue to collaborate on all curricular areas while promoting a growth mindset for our staff and students. Grade level teams work in concert with special education and remedial support staff, commit to a minimum of one hour per week to collaborate for improving student achievement, reviewing common assessments, and developing interventions and extensions for students. Students access technology programs on chrome books and iPads that provide opportunities for differentiated learning. These efforts support the continued growth and success of all members of our school community.
